Each Sunday morning we gather in our beautiful sanctuary for prayer, praise, and worship. Our minister, Rev. Sandra Cox, encourages, comforts, and challenges us to live God's word in our daily lives. The Knox congregation and choir lift their voices in song under the direction of John Lindsay-Botten. Musical



accompaniment may be piano, organ and occasionally a variety of other instruments. Our youth choir, SpiritSong, enhances worship with a musical selection about once a month. Children attend church with their families until the "All Ages Learning" time, after which they are welcome to participate in our exciting Church School GO! Curriculum. Our service is enriched by Sandra Spears, who provides American Sign Language interpretation. An audio loop is available for those with hearing aids. May collection for the Beacon House — In May we are collecting shampoo, deodorant, razors, hygiene products and soap for Beacon House. The amount of donations they receive of these type of products is far less than the demand.

The April Community Outreach Meal Event was prepared by St. John

Evangelist Anglican Church. They served 202 meals to guests and also fed about 20-25 volunteers. The next meal is May 16<sup>th</sup> and St. Francis by the Lakes will be preparing the meal.

The summer **Community Outreach Meal Event** takes the form of a **BBQ.** This year the summer meal will take place July 13<sup>th</sup> from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. We will need Knox folks to help with set up at 9:30 a.m. and clean up at 1:30 p.m. The donation of a slab cake would be appreciated. We are also in need of free-standing awnings if anyone has one they would loan us for the day. This is a wonderful day with food and entertainment. Last year about 350 people attended.

The **FOOD TRUCK** plans are coming along. We have applied for a grant to purchase some equipment, as food safety and best practices for preparation must be followed. We will be putting out a call for food donations in the fall as well as looking for people to assist with cooking. Start date should be somewhere between mid-September and the beginning of October, and will continue until mid-April. This is mainly because the Salvation Army uses the truck mid-to-late April to respond to flood emergencies, such as what is happening in New Brunswick right now.



#### **ARTWORK FOR HALIFAX HOSPICE**

Holly Hunter, artist and member of our Knox Outreach Committee, was contacted In December of 2018 regarding proposed artwork for the new Halifax Hospice. Each patient's room was to be named after a tree and the planning committee felt that it would be nice to have a picture of the designated tree outside the door of each room. Holly contacted her network of artist friends and they agreed to provide paintings that are original and will help to create the warm, homelike environment that was envisioned for the hospice. Six artists volunteered their talents to provide ten paintings in different styles and mediums which were donated to the hospice in March 2019. The artists were honoured to have been able to create the paintings for the hospice, and they hope their work will enhance the

#### Pastoral Care Focus – Grief Support

The Pastoral Care Team has been offering a Grief Support series to those interested for many years now. These were originally facilitated by John Thornton and Judy Hayes and the last couple of years Judy has offered them, after having been mentored by John for many years.

The groups usually consist of 4-6 individuals and the group comes together for about 90 minutes a week for 5-6 weeks. We have had Knox congregational members, as well as other community members. Like many other support groups, it is the participants who determine most of the content and direction of the sessions. Some theory about the grieving process is offered and then the individuals share stories and experiences and have an opportunity to share as much or as little of their personal journey as they choose. Bonds are built or extended as individuals open their hearts to both give and receive care and support from each other. 
#### KNOX WALKING GROUP


