<u>**Welcome and Lighting of the Affirmation Candle</u>

One: Merry Christmas, and welcome to worship at Knox United Church this evening! My name is the Rev. Penny Nelson, and I am the minister here at Knox United.

We gather in the warmth of so much light this evening. After weeks of waiting and watching the light be rekindled in our Advent wreath, the circle has come to completion. This night, we celebrate the light of Christ that is born into this world, symbolized by our Christ candle.

As we gather for worship on this special night, let us take time to express our thanks for the land and waters in which we live, work, and play. Many people call the land in which we live here "Nova Scotia," but for thousands of years before this, these lands and waters had another name called "Mi'kma'ki". This is the name that the Mi'kmaq people still know for this place, and tonight, I invite us to pause for a moment of gratitude to say thank you to the lands, the waters, the birds, the trees and the peoples of Mi'kma'ki for all the ways in which life is nurtured in this place. (*pause for a moment*)

As we célebrate the birth of hope, peace, joy, and love this night, let us wonder how each of us might honour the land and water of Mi'kma'ki, and live in peace and friendship with all people of this land.

And through our Affirmation Candle, we celebrate the light of Christ that is born in us! In our Black, Brown, white, Asian, and Indigenous bodies—this night, Christ is born again in our gay, straight, queer, trans, non-binary bodies! Christ is born in our abled and disabled bodies, in all of our cognitive diversity, Christ is born, and God names this *good*. And so, this night, as we do each time we gather as this community of faith, we celebrate that:

> All are welcome in this place. All are welcome by God's grace.

Call to Worship:

Tonight is Christmas Eve, the holiest of nights!

Tonight, the earth sings with angels and the sky is lit with a Bethlehem star.

From far and wide, we travel with the shepherds to meet God's gift to the world, singing: "O holy child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray; cast out our sin and enter in, be born in us today."

"We hear the Christmas the angels, the great glad tidings tell; O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel!"

Opening Prayer:

One: It is night after a long day. What is done is done. What is not done is not done. Now leaving behind our cares, let us deeply breathe in God's new life. Let us rest in God's love and presence, and let ourselves begin again tonight.

Words of Assurance One: God's love knows no bounds. Love comes down at Christmas a love so deep and profound that nothing will ever be the same again. So, may you know this night that this love has come for you to heal you, forgive you, guide you, and inspire you. Receive this gift, this love, and live your lives to share it. Thanks be to God! Amen.

Advent Candle Lighting Liturgy:

Worship Leader: Over a hundred people, from the ages of two to eighty years old, were asked to fill in the blank for the statement: "My story is. . . " From the voices of different generations, hear their answers:

Voice 1: Amazing!

- Voice 2: Just beginning.
- Voice 3: A wee bit messy, with lots of love.
- Voice 4: Privileged.
- Voice 1: Hopeful.
- Voice 2: Full of laughter.
- Voice 3: Incomplete, thank goodness.
- Voice 4: Long, but good.
- Voice 1: One of resilience.
- Voice 2: Still unfolding.
- Voice 3: Multilingual.
- Voice 4: A work in progress.
- Voice 1: My story is not just mine, it's tied to yours.

Voice 2: Tonight we tell the story that we tell every year—the story of Christ's birth, the story of love made flesh. It's a story that weaves through every generation. It's a story that picks up the bits and pieces of our narrative and braids us together. (*Another worship leader or reader lights the candle*.)

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil: for thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.
